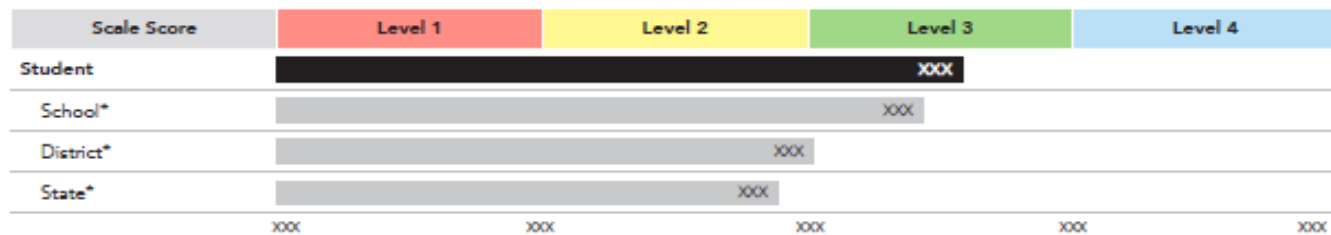

About the Nevada End of Course (EOC) Examinations

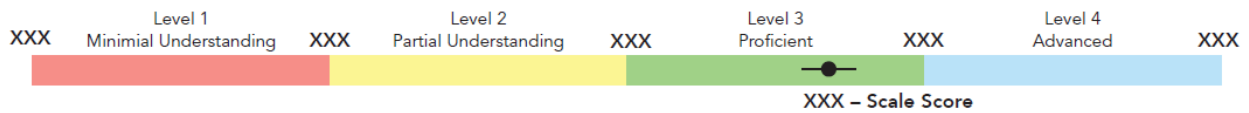
As required by state law, Nevada Revised Statute 390.600, four End of Course (EOC) examinations are required for students to graduate starting with the graduating class of 2019. Each EOC examination measures how well a student understands the subject area tested. Students take the EOCs at the conclusion of corresponding courses during the school career. End of Course examinations are administered in the following subjects:

- English Language Arts (ELA) with a focus on Reading Comprehension and Writing (Begins with Class of 2020)
- English Language Arts I (ELA I) with a focus on Reading Comprehension (Class of 2018 and 2019)
- English Language Arts II (ELA II) with a focus on Writing (Class of 2018 and 2019)
- Mathematics I with a focus on Algebra I (Class of 2018 and Beyond)
- Mathematics II with a focus on Geometry (Class of 2018 and Beyond)
- Science with a focus on Life Science (Begins with Class of 2020)
